Under no circumstances will any member of the Crematorium staff open the casket or container. The Crematorium labeling system ensures proper identification throughout the cremation process. The casket or container is placed by itself in the cremation chamber, where the temperature is raised to approximately 1000 degrees Celsius. After approximately 1 to 1 1/2 hours, all organic matter will have been burned or evaporated. The residue is inorganic fragments (mostly bones). The Crematorium-trained staff carefully removes all recoverable cremated remains from the chamber. Any metallic material is removed and disposed of by the Crematorium. The sampling of cremated remains are reduced by a mechanical process to unidentifiable dimensions and placed in a temporary container. In the event the urn or container is insufficient to accommodate all of the cremated remains of the deceased, any excess cremated remains will be placed in a secondary container and returned together with the primary urn or container. **Under the FBCSA, O. Reg 30/11, s186** the Crematorium Operator has the right to refuse to cremate in any case without assigning reason(s).

Applicant's Declarations and Acknowledgements

_____ **Legal Authority:** The applicant declares that he/she is legally authorized to make, or charged with the responsibility for the arrangements contained in the contract.

_____ **Consumer Information Guide, Pricelist and By-laws:** By initialing here, the purchaser acknowledges receiving a copy of the Ontario Government's Consumer Information Guide (where made available by the Registrar) and the crematorium price list and by-laws at the time of entering into this contract.

_____ **Provision of Services and Supplies within 30 Days:** The Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act 2002 provides the Purchaser with the right to cancel a contract within 30 days following the signing of the contract. The Purchaser acknowledges that the services and supplies included in this contract are for the recipient, whose death has occurred, and must be provided or delivered within the 30-day period. The Purchaser therefore waives all rights and entitlement to the cancellation of contracted services and supplies which have been provided to facilitate the cremation.

_____ **Possession of Cremated Remains and Refundable Deposit:** By initialing, the Purchaser authorizes the Provider to take possession of the cremated remains of the recipient. The Purchaser agrees to pay a refundable deposit of \$350 to the Provider. The Provider will retain the cremated remains for one year from the date of cremation. If the cremated remains are not claimed within one year, the Provider may inter the cremated remains in a cemetery, including in a common lot for which the cemetery is the interment rights holder, and the Provider may retain the deposit referred to in this section. If the cremated remains are claimed before they are interred, the Operator will refund any deposit paid.

_____ **Radioactive or Microscopic Implants and Pacemakers:** I understand that the Crematorium will not cremate a dead human body if:

- i) The body has a pacemaker
- ii) The body has a radioactive implant, except that a body that has a radioactive implant can be cremated if:
 - A) it is at least two years after the day the body received the implant, or
 - B) a lesser time has passed since the body received the implant and it is safe to cremate the body

I further understand that an implant, heart pacemaker or other implant radioactive devices could explode during the cremation process. If such a device is present, I have instructed the funeral establishment or transfer service operator, or other, to remove it before the deceased is delivered to the crematorium for cremation. I agree that in the event of my failure to notify the funeral establishment or transfer service operator, or any others responsible for the removal of such a device, I will be liable for any damages to the Crematorium or injury to the Cremation staff.

Processing: I/we authorize the Crematory to open the cremation chamber during the cremation process and reposition the remains of the Deceased in order to facilitate a complete and thorough cremation. Certain items, including but not limited to, body prostheses, dentures, dental bridgework, dental fillings, jewelry and other personal items accompanying the remains in the cremation chamber will be separated from the cremated remains of the deceased and deposited by the Crematorium. I understand that there are few, if any remains following the cremation of a fetus or very young child.

Storage of Cremated Remains: If requested by the applicant, the Crematorium will temporarily store cremated remains for a maximum period of one (1) year. If at the end of one (1) year the cremated remains are unclaimed, the Crematorium owner will attempt to contact the applicant to finalize the disposition and memorialization of the cremated remains. If the applicant cannot be contacted, the Crematorium owner will arrange to bury the cremated remains in a common grave within the Cemetery in accordance with the FBCSA, Ontario Regulation 30/11, and the Crematorium by-laws. The applicant shall be responsible for the cost of such burial. The Crematorium and Cemetery operator will maintain a record of the date and location of the burials in a common grave.

Payment Terms: Payment for this contract is due upon signing, and on the date of this contract. Amounts outstanding after any payment due date will bear interest at the rate of 21% per annum, calculated daily and compounded monthly, from the payment due date until paid in full. There will be a charge of \$40.00 for any non-sufficient funds (NSF) cheque returned by the bank. Any costs of collection shall be the responsibility of the Applicant.

Warranties: A) The Crematorium does not warrant expressly or otherwise, the goods provided under the contract, except where required by the Consumer Protection Act, S.O. 2002 Chapter 30, Schedule A, sec. 9. The only warranties of good which may apply are those extended by the manufacturers of the goods. B) The Crematorium warrants that the services under this contract will be provided with reasonable care and skill.

Scattering and Co-Mingling of Cremated Remains: The Crematorium will not without the written and signed consent of the applicant for cremation, co-mingle the cremated remains of more than one person. The purchaser understands and accepts that as a result of authorizing the scattering of cremated remains within a scattering ground, the cremated remains will not be retrievable, and the cremated remains will be co-mingled with other cremated remains. While every effort will be made to avoid co-mingling, inadvertent cremated remains from the previous cremation is a possibility, and is hereby sanctioned.

I understand that pursuant to legislation and/or the Crematorium's regulations that no cremation may take place until;

- (a) A duly executed burial permit has been delivered to the Crematorium.
- (b) This application form is completed fully, signed and has been delivered to the Crematorium
- (c) Payment for the cremation in accordance with the Crematorium tariff of rates.
- (d) A Coroner's Certificate has been signed by a Coroner and delivered to the Crematorium.

I hereby certify that all information contained in this application form has been explained to the applicant and the identity of the deceased has been verified.

Caskets/containers used for cremation must be made of wood or other combustible material. By law, the Crematorium cannot cremate caskets or containers that consists of, or has on or in it material made of or containing non-flammable or hazardous material or chlorinated or fiber-reinforced plastic, other than incidental metal used in the construction of the casket/container or accompanying material. Prior to cremation, casket handles and other exterior fittings may be removed and later disposed of by the Crematorium.
